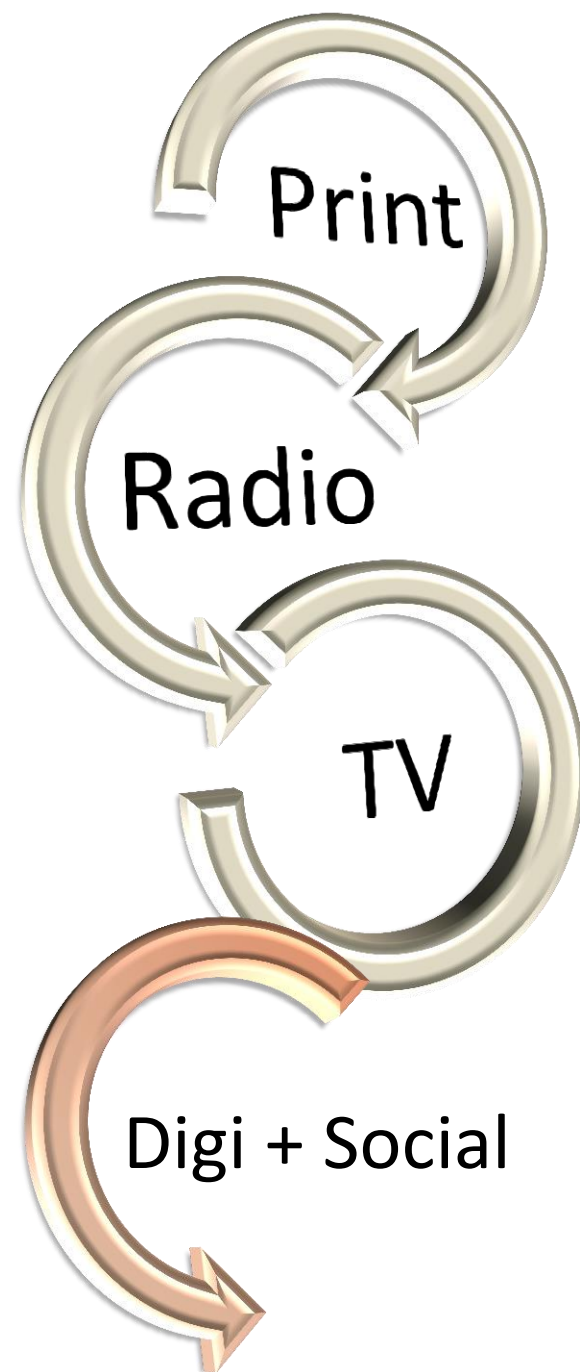

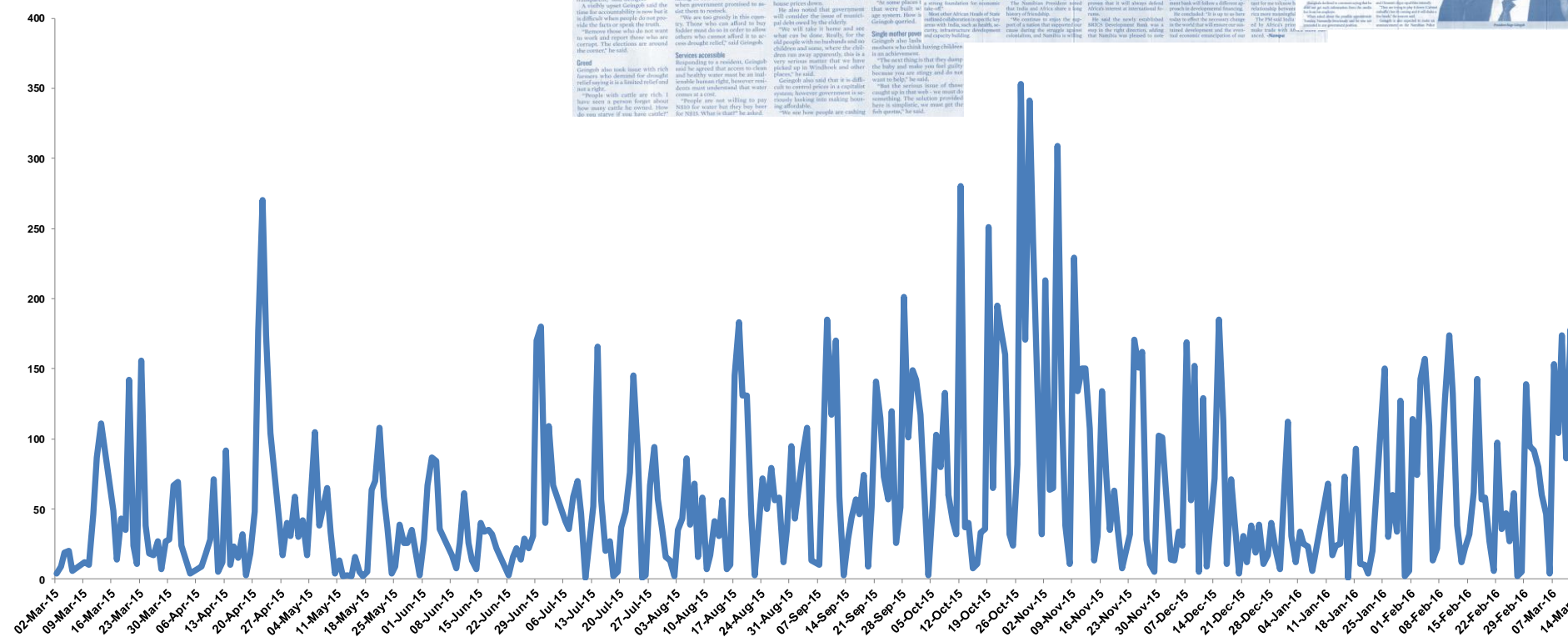

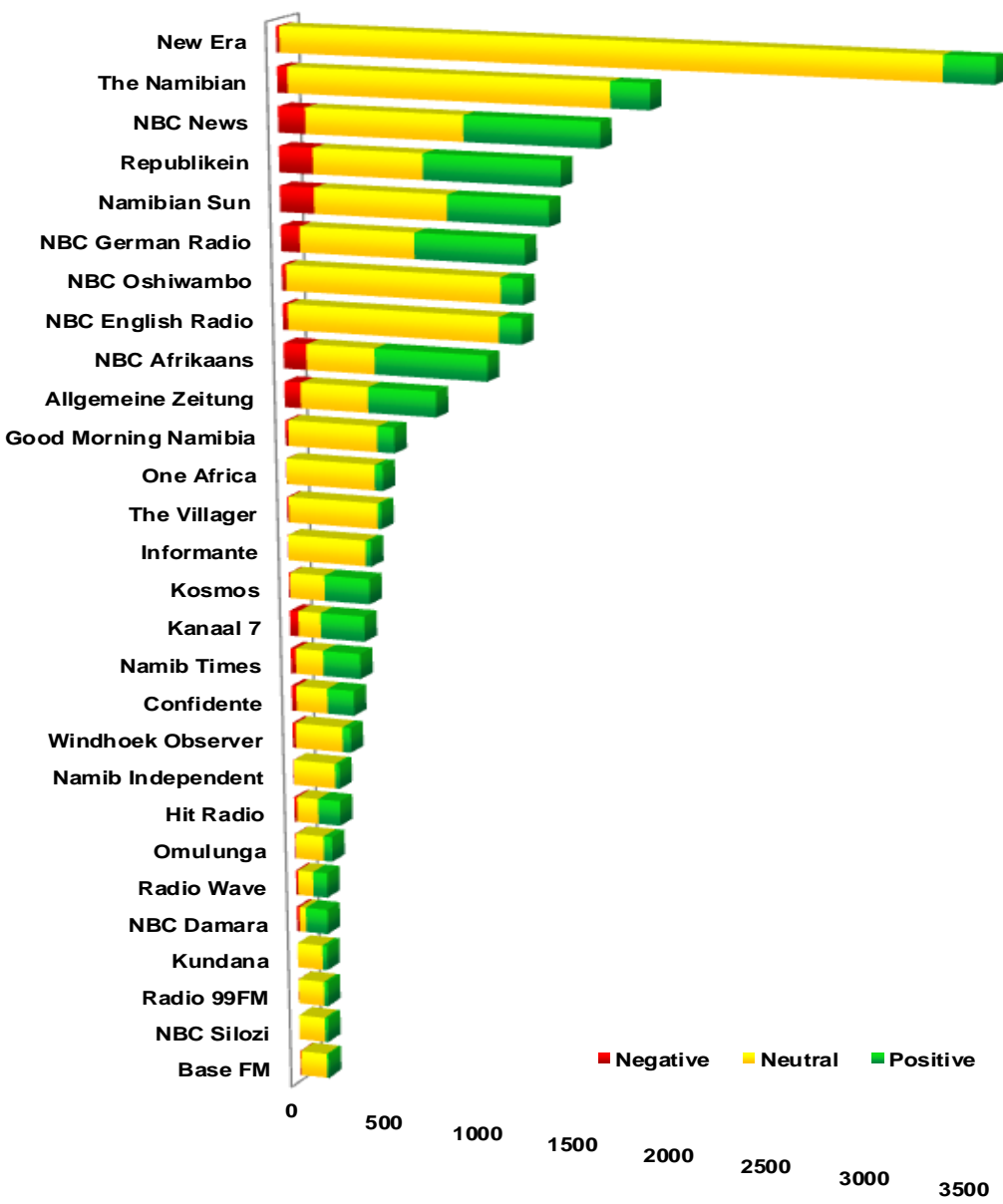

- Following Presidential Spokesperson Albertus Aochamub; the opposition leader Venaani most actively voiced presidential matters

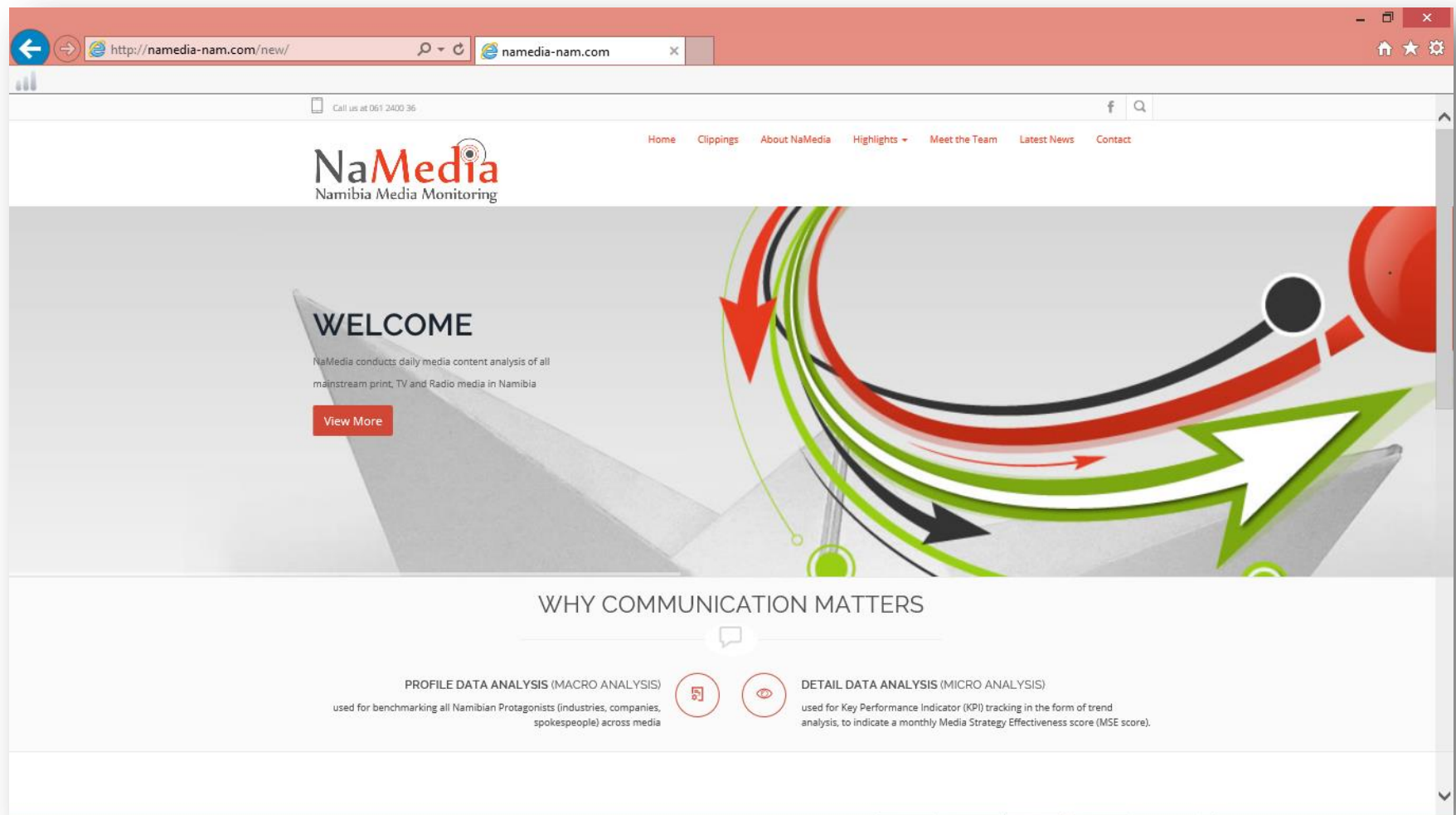
